Indigenous first for Anglicans.

The Anglican Church has appointed its first Indigenous Dean. Bishop Chris McLeod, a Gurindji man, will become dean of St. Peter's Cathedral in North Adelaide.

Bishop McLeod was ordained as Assistant Bishop of Adelaide in 2015. He was the third indigenous Bishop in the country.

Now, he has become South Australia's first Indigenous Dean. He said he looked forward to working with the Adelaide Anglican community, but particularly Indigenous members of the church.

"I look forward to working with the Cathedral in strengthening our service to the community, especially with the First Nations' people of Adelaide," said Bishop McLeod who will remain as national Aboriginal Bishop.
